## Minutes From April 20, 2009 Meeting at Maxine's House

Meeting called to order at 7:37 pm and closed at 9:35pm.

Present: Karen, Steve, Phyllis, Marie, Maxine, Andi, Lisa

## Old/New Business:

- Treasurer's Report: We have a balance of \$2,091.49
- Materials fees and guild dues discussion
  - o The discussion as to whether the Guild should cover materials fees for programs or whether members should continue to cover them continued at this meeting. We also discussed whether dues need to be increased just to cover the cost of programs since we have less of an income stream (cards as the only fundraiser; in the past we have sold calendars every couple

- of years as a fundraiser and we also had guild participation in the annual sale which provided income for the guild.)
- o After a lengthy discussion of the issues, including a discussion of making another guild calendar as a fundraiser, a motion was made to change the bylaws as follows: keep materials fees for programs paid by the members present at meetings, keep the dues for associate members out of town at \$10/year, raise dues for associate members who live in the area and for active members to \$25/year. Per our by-laws, this will be voted on at the next meeting. To quote our by-laws: "10. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a 2/3 vote of the members present, provided that notice of the proposed change has been given at the preceding meeting."
- The exact proposed wording changes for the by laws are as follows: Current by-laws:
  - "4. Dues shall be payable in June. Dues are \$20 for active members, \$20 for associate members who live in the area, and \$10 for associate members who live far away."

Proposed by-laws (with changes bolded and underlined)

- "4. Dues shall be payable in June. Dues are \$25 for active members, \$25 for associate members who live in the area, and \$10 for associate members who live far away."
- o Remember: This proposal will be voted on at the May meeting
- For those few people that still have not paid dues for this year, they will be contacted over the summer to see if they still want to be part of the guild. Members must pay dues to remain in the guild.
- Program Ideas for Next Year:
  - Marie has been hard at work lining up programs for the guild for next year. Some of the ideas include: Joan Dreyer (stitched wall pieces), Beryl Taylor (mixed media), Gail Gondek (embellished pieces), program on polymer clay boxes or buttons, possibly a crocheted button program...   - Guild Challenge idea for next year Marie proposed a "Mixed Bag" theme for our guild challenge for next year. She brought in this great calendar that had a different bag/purse/etc for each day of the year.
